POIGNANT YEAR FOR BANGOR SIR KNIGHTS

IN what was a poignant year for the Sir Knights of Sir Henry Wilson Memorial RBP 1104, Bangor, the members commemorated the 90th anniversary of the murder of Field Marshal Sir Henry Wilson, MP, on 22nd June 1922.

He was assassinated by two IRA men, Reginald Dunne and Joseph O'Sullivan, on the doorstep of his home at 36 Eaton Place in London.

Dunne and O'Sullivan were caught, subsequently tried at the Old Bailey, found guilty of the murder and hanged at Wandsworth Prison. Sir Henry, who was an Ulster Unionist MP for North Down at Westminster, was born at Ballygraine, Ballinalee in County Longford. He was one of the most senior British Army officers of World War I and played an important role in Anglo-French military relations both before the war and in 1914. He was also military advisor to the Prime Minister, serving as Chief of the Imperial General Staff.

It is generally thought that the IRA's commander-in-chief, Michael Collins, ordered his murder to provoke the British Government into retaliating to the continu-

ing Troubles in Northern Ireland. Two weeks after the murder, Collins was ambushed and shot dead in his home county of Cork by anti-treaty IRA men.

The preceptory paraded in Ballynahinch on Black Saturday as part of the County Down Grand Black Chapter demonstration.

As well, RBP 1104 held its annual "Floating of the Banner" parade in the village of Crawfordsburn prior to the County demonstration.

Ancestral painting finds new home in Brownlow House

A BEAUTIFUL painting of Tynan Abbey, ancestral home of the Stronge family, will occupy a prominent place in Brownlow House, as the result of a kind gesture by the owner of the painting.

Ballymena woman Mrs Doris Spence handed over the painting at an informal ceremony in Brownlow House when it was accepted by Sir Knight William Abernethy, Imperial Grand Treasurer, on behalf of the Royal Black Institution.

Tynan Abbey was destroyed during the murderous attack by an IRA gang in 1981 which claimed the lives of Sir Norman Stronge and his son James.

Sir Norman Stronge, Speaker in the Northern Ireland House of Commons for many years, was Imperial Grand

Master of the Royal Black Institution and he gave a lifetime of service to his country and to the Crown.

The painting of Tynan Abbey, which depicts the Manor House and its colourful grounds contains the name "D Stronge", and the year 1912, and the painter was presumably a member of the Stronge family.

It belonged to Mrs Spence's father, the late Mr George Hanthorn, who was prominent in the Ulster Unionist Party in Portadown some years ago.Mrs Spence wondered if the Royal Black Institution would be interested in acquiring the painting, and her husband, Billy, contacted his friend and journalistic colleague, Brian Courtney.

Brian, a member of the Royal Black Institution, spoke to senior Officers and they were delighted at the offer by Mrs Spence.

Aghadowey Centenary

AGIVEY RBP 843, Aghadowey is celebrating its Centenary.


In July 1912 a Warrant was issued in the name of Agivey RBP 843 and the first meeting was held in Agivey Orange Hall on the 29th August.

The first Worshipful Master, Sir Knight Samuel Shiels, was elected and installed and the meeting then proceeded to initiate five Sir Knights with the work of the Lecturers being carried out by two Sir Knights from RPB 99.

In September 1912 more young men were initiated into the Preceptory and one of them was a young man by the name of Norman Stronge, better known in later life as Sir Norman Stronge, Sovereign Grand Master. He remained a member until 1945 when the family left the area to live in Tynan Abbey and he then transferred to RBP 264.

During the last 100 years the members have played a full part in the Royal Black Institution with the Preceptory providing four Sir Knights as Worshipful District Masters of Coleraine Royal Black District Chapter No 1; two Sir Knights as County Grand Masters of County Londonderry Grand Black Chapter; one Sir Knight as Assistant Sovereign Grand Master and many others holding office at District and County level.

A Special Service was held on Sunday 23rd September in Aghadowey Parish Church with a Centenary Dinner planned for Oct 5.




The Preceptory is led by

the Northern Ireland Tourist
Board and Tourism Ireland
attended the event last year to
see the spectacle for themselves. This year the special
guest was the Northern Ireland
Secretary of State Owen

Last year a survey was carried out at the Sham Fight on behalf of the Institution. A team of 15 researchers interviewed 559 people who were spectators along different parts of the parade route.

Of those interviewed, 52.8% came from Co. Armagh, 24.3% from Co. Down, 10.7% from Antrim, 5% from Co. Londonderry and 1.1% came from outside Northern Ireland.

Twenty six per cent of the male spectators interviewed

were in the Orange Order and 6% of the women belonged to the Women's Orange Institution. Twelve per cent of the men watching the parade were in the Royal Black Institution.

Only 5% of spectators interviewed were making their first trip to the Sham Fight and 63% had been there every year for the previous five

The platform proceedings began at 2.45pm and the Chairman was Sir Knight Stanley McFarland, Omagh District Master.



Reflections

I CAN'T help noticing that every time I go to the barber the hair that lands on the floor seems to have more gray in it. I've tried convincing myself that it is getting mixed up with someone else's...but that's just wishful thinking! It happens to all of us - quickly or slowly - when we're younger or when we're older...that is if we hang on to it at all!

The Bible tells us in Proverbs 16:31, "The hoary [or grey] head is a crown of glory". So we shouldn't really look on it as such a bad thing.

The Psalmist in Psalm 71:18 pleads: "Now also when I am old and grayheaded, O God, forsake me not; until I have shewed thy strength unto this generation, and thy power to every one that is to come". The Psalmist sees the passing of the years in his hair and this acts as a spur to him. He declines to succumb to age or melancholy, but rather feels challenged and so cries for help. He wants enablement to tell others about the Lord. This desire is not limited to his own generation - we read that he looks to the future and wants others to know - that means he wants us to know.

So what is his message? It comes straight from the Bible, God's Word to us. It is our standard. It is our rule of faith and practice. This compilation of books is centred on Jesus Christ: who he is, why he came, and what he did.

Who He Is: Jesus is the eternal son of God, the second person of the Trinity, or as it is summed up in Matthew 1:23, "Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us." Why He Came: Jesus came as a substitute - as sinners we cannot stand before God who is pure and holy because of our sin. What He Did: Jesus suffered and died in the place of sinners, and that means everyone because "...all have sinned and come short of the glory of God"! (Romans 3:23) Jesus died the agonising, horrific death of crucifixion so that we could obtain salvation. John 3:16-17 states, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. 17 For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved."

This most precious of gifts can be accepted by repentance and faith. We must abhor our sin, and turn to Christ asking him to forgive and accept us into his family. It is all about Jesus and what he has done. And when Christ has saved us from our sin we can wholeheartedly join with our Protestant forefathers in doing everything to the glory of God - Soli Deo Gloria.

We may well feel just a little overwhelmed by this challenge to do everything to God's glory, but the Apostle Paul gives encouragement in 2 Corinthians 4:5-7: "For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord...that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us." This means we simply do what we can in our families, communities, and globally, to the very best of our ability. Our involvement with the hospital in Kiwoko, Uganda, or the 20,000 tracts that have been printed to mark the Ulster Covenant of 1912, should encourage us that we can do something.

THERE was wide praise for the Royal Black Institution's Open Letter following the events of the Last Saturday demonstration in Belfast.

The Institution showed a true Christian spirit by reaching out to people of another faith.

While standing firm to the principles of the Reformed Faith, the Institution apologised to the clergy and parishioners of St Patrick's Roman Catholic Church and in so doing helped calm a tense situation in Belfast.

OPEN LETTER

THE Royal Black Institution wishes to respond to comments made following the Last Saturday demonstration in Belfast on August 25.

The Belfast demonstration consisted of 63 preceptories and 33 bands. The "contentious" part of the route, as defined by the Parades Commission, consisted of approximately 200 yards, past mostly commercial premises and a Catholic Church, on a main arterial route into the city centre.

Throughout Northern Ireland that day, a total of 390 preceptories, including 17,000 members of the Royal Black Institution - and bands - paraded at six locations.

The City of Belfast Grand Black Chapter had never previously held its Last Saturday demonstration in the city. This was a special parade to mark the centenary of the signing of the Ulster Covenant. Each year their Last Saturday parade is held outside Belfast and that arrangement will resume next year, as planned.

Through its stand for the Reformed Christian Faith, the Royal Black Institution has doctrinal differences with the Roman Catholic Church but we want to make it absolutely clear that the anger of the Royal Black Institution is not directed at St. Patrick's Church. We apologise for any offence to the clergy and parishioners of St. Patrick's Church.

We have always had good lines of communication with the Roman Catholic Church

and we would intend to continue to maintain and consolidate these, away from the public gaze.

The sense of injustice and hurt felt by the members of the Royal Black Institution is focussed on the Parades Commission and its irrational and often irresponsible determinations.

Parading is embedded in the DNA of the Protestant community but the Parades Commission has shown an appalling lack of understanding about what that means.

They consistently pander to the demands of people who have gone out of their way to be offended and whose aim is to remove all traces of the Reformed Christian Faith and cleanse Protestant culture from society.

The Institution calls on our politicians to remove the Parades Commission, an unelected quango, and to have it replaced within a democratic framework where decisions will be held accountable to the people.

To that end we are hoping to have an early meeting with the Northern Ireland Secretary of State to repeat our message that the current Parades Commission is a major hindrance to the development of democracy within this country. We have asked to meet the leaders of the three unionist parties in the Northern Ireland Assembly to enlist their support in bringing about the demise of the Parades Commission. We have also requested meetings with Protestant church leaders to give them an insight into the strength of feeling on the ground. The Royal Black Institution is founded on Christian principles and all of our processions are to and from an act of worship.

Our Institution is determined to play its full part in civic society and make Northern Ireland a peaceful and prosperous part of the United Kingdom, where cultural diversity is respected.






MOTHERWELL RBDC No 6 will be holding their Annual Burns Supper in Motherwell Orange Hall on Saturday 12th January 2013.

Volunteers' life-changing trip

THE Royal Black Institution sent a team of volunteers to Uganda to help a hospital which has special links to Northern Ireland.

The Institution made a communitybased hospital in Uganda its designated charity for 2010 and sent 20 volunteers to work there for three weeks in the Summer of 2011. They provided a wide range of skills to support the hospital.

Kiwoko Hospital is a community-based facility of 245 beds in the Luwero area of Uganda and was chosen by the Institution to benefit from fundraising over the year.

Kiwoko Hospital was opened in 1988 by Drlan Clarke, formerly from Bangor in Co. Down. He became the only doctor to tens of thousands of people in an area, half the size of Northern Ireland.

The Kiwoko Hospital is a Christianbased centre, which also has a special dedicated mission, helping to spread the Christian message in the area. The motto of the hospital is "We treat, Jesus saves".

These are some of the comments from Royal Black Sir Knights and volunteers who helped at the Kiwoko Hospital...

Sir Knight Andy McRoberts, Banbridge RBP District No 6: "I belong to Banbridge RBP District No 6 and was District Master for three years. It was during my term as District Master that the idea of a trip going out to Kiwoko was mentioned. I had considered it at the time but due to work commitments was unable to do more about it. It wasn't until later on that I finally decided to go.

"The group consisted of 17 men from across Northern Ireland. At first I was a bit nervous as I did not know any of the other men that were going out, but that was soon to change as we all got on so well and we made friends so quick.

"There was a team of builders, mechanics, some electricians and a few farmers. Everyone soon got to know what sort of job they were there to do and we all got started.

"We had to do some work in the theatre

inside the hospital. We changed plugs for them and put in new emergency lights so that the doctors in the theatre could still work if the electric went off. We had to be in the theatre at 7am to get the work finished before the doctors' day would begin. There were oxygen machines needed for the theatre and premature baby unit that were not working and some of the extra money that we all got from the sponsorship helped buy new machines and it was lovely to see these machines being used for the small babies.

"Personally, it gave me such a good feeling to see the babies and children that we could make such a change to their lives with the stuff we brought out with us and the work we did to help. It was just amazing."

Sir Knight Keith Black, Ahoghill RBP 173: "I have decided to talk about a typical day in Kiwoko as part of the Royal Black Institutions team to Uganda in 2011.

"A working day began early with breakfast and then off to Morning Worship held in either the Hospital Canteen with the Doctors, Nurses and staff or with the builders at a container in the hospital grounds. This gave us a good chance to interact with those round us and be part of their everyday hospital life.

"After morning worship it was off to work, during which we got the chance to go out and see how the people of Uganda go about their lives how they live and work and it was such a blessing to be able to tell them who we were and where we had come from.

"Tea break and lunch gave us a time to rest during the day and with such a warm climate we really needed it with temperatures hitting nearly 40 degrees on the warmest day, but that still didn't stop us from having a good cup of tea.

"After the working day was done we usually had the chance to go to student prayer meetings or meet with the key people that play such a big part in the hospital. This was such an encouragement to us and to them as well, as we got to share a lot about ourselves and the Institution."

Ian McCafferty: "Arriving in Entebbe and traveling to Kiwoko was a mind-opening experience in itself, seeing the poverty and the numbers of people lining the sides of the road was amazing and really quite humbling.

"Working with the locals, meeting and getting to know a little bit of their culture, language, life style, attitudes to life and their sense of humour was very fulfilling and great fun.

"At Goshen School, I felt despair that so many children are orphans and abandoned, but the work of the school and the care and education they are getting is an inspiration. "While I found some of it emotionally difficult and challenging, I really enjoyed the trip and seeing the work that is being done at Kiwoko."

Tommy McAllister: "I helped carry out maintenance checks and essential repairs to ambulances and to mini-buses, which the hospital use to transport patients and to provide medical care to people living in the bush.

"Our visit to Goshen Primary School was inspiring. Some of the children there are orphans and although they were happy with the care they were given, it was lovely to see their pleasure in the few gifts we brought with us.

"It was also very moving to watch as a family had fun choosing clothes they liked from a selection of second hand items

"The most enjoyable activity was handing out gifts which we brought for the local children. They were thrilled with the skipping-ropes, bouncy balls and frisbees but their favourites were the football kits and balloons!

"Although it was quite a tiring few days it was a privilege to meet and work with such lovely people.

"The purpose of my visit to Uganda was to help the people there and hopefully I did, but they taught me to appreciate the important things in life."

Alan Goody: "The need here is appalling. Everywhere you turn there is squalor, poverty dirt and disease. The people are delighted to have a doctor and the response has been overwhelming.

"The main work project was the building of two houses, essentially required to attract doctors to the hospital. However our group's talent was further put to good use in upgrading the electrical system and repairing various forms of transport.

"No matter where you are in Uganda you are never far from their children. They love the Muzungu (pale visitor) always coming to welcome us. They are such a happy wonderful people, who whilst they have nothing, they want for nothing.

"May God continue to bless them as they do His work at Kiwoko Hospital, Uganda."

Alex Skuce (Age 16): "At times, life may throw difficulties at us and we may think we have nothing at all, but compared to people in Kiwoko, we have everything we need. Nothing will prepare you for the reality of how these people live.

"I had a life-changing experience during my time in Uganda. During our stay we were building accommodation for doctors and nurses to help attract them to the remote hospital of Kiwoko. The work was physically demanding in the heat but despite this the team worked exceptionally well together, guided by the team leader, Ian McCafferty.


Blackskull charity walk
